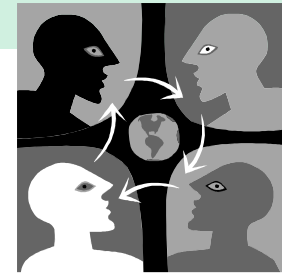

A Professional Development Online Experience for Licensed Social Workers (3 Continuing Education Hours)

Educational Goals and Objectives

This online coursework is designed to assist participants in developing a new awareness about the process of change. Lessons will be delivered via online video streaming featuring family therapist and trainer of therapists, Virginia Satir. The goal is for students to understand the process of change model and use it as a tool when working through the process of change with clients. Objectives include:

- Understanding the five major stages of the change process
- Awareness of the transition between stages
- Dealing with coping methods for each stage
- Recognizing the effects each stage has on feelings, thinking, performance, and physiology

Each module will be supplemented by a reading assignment. Upon completion of all seven modules each student will be required to complete the workshop post test. Post test results require a passing score of 70% or higher to receive continuing education hours.

Course Target

The course is directed at persons in the helping professions who are dealing with change in systems. Social workers, counselors, teachers and students of human services would find the material helpful. This program can be useful to most practitioners and is targeted at BSW and higher.

Virginia Satir 1936 BA, Education, University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, 1948 MA, University of Chicago, School of Social Service Administration, 1978 Awarded an honorary doctorate in Social Sciences, University of Wisconsin. She was awarded several other honorary doctorates including one by the Professional School of Psychological Studies, 1986. She died in 1988.

Stephen B. Buckbee MSW, LPC is a partner in BDD Training Associates. He is a retired full time teacher from Bay de Noc Community College in Escanaba, Michigan, where he had been employed since 1984 as the coordinator of the Human Services Program and Social Sciences Instructor. Stephen is the recipient of a number of awards for teaching excellence. He is licensed as a Masters Social Worker, Clinical and Macro License, and has worked in a number of contexts – – – ranging from community mental health, law enforcement counseling, to substance abuse inpatient and outpatient treatment programs. He is a past president and a member of Avanta, The Virginia Satir Network (Founded by Satir). He is also a clinical member of the Satir Institute of the Pacific.
