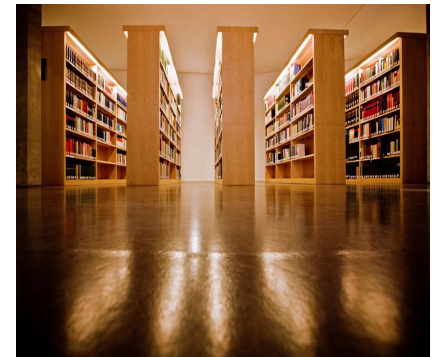

Who is eligible to join the Honors Program?

Entering new freshmen with a high school GPA of 3.2 or higher, **and/or** composite ACT score of 23 or higher, **and/or** COMPASS test equivalents

Current students who have completed 12 credits (at Bay or another college) with GPA of 3.2 or higher **and/or** have earned Phi Theta Kappa membership

Students in **all academic majors** or programs of study

Dual-enrolled students are encouraged to apply to the Honors Program **after** they complete high school and enroll at Bay



What are the requirements to complete the Honors Program?

Complete a minimum of **15 honors credits**

Maintain **overall 3.5 college GPA**

Complete all requirements for an Associates Degree (Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate of Applied Science degree)

Apply for graduation

Honors Courses

Honors courses may be available in areas such as Anthropology, Chemistry, History, Communications, English, Leadership, Math, Nursing, Political Science, and a variety of technical/occupational areas

Honors courses are **not available online** at this time

Suggested Honors Curriculum

Specific honors course requirements are flexible and can be adapted to each student's individual academic program

1st Semester: Honors course in a General Education area

2nd Semester: Honors course in a General Education area

3rd Semester: Honors course in student's academic major (if available)

4th Semester: Honors Leadership Development Studies course
