Associate in Applied Science Degree

About the Degree

The Associate in Applied Science in Corrections degree combines general education with coursework designed to prepare criminal justice students interested in a career in Corrections for immediate entry into the workforce upon graduation. This program provides a balance of technical, vocational, and liberal study courses. Eligible students also have the opportunity to complete an internship at a criminal justice agency and gain real world experience in the corrections field.

Career Options

Graduates of the Associate in Applied Science in Corrections can enter the workforce as a correctional officer at a jail, prison, or detention center. They can also work in community-based corrections programs, such as tether and community service work programs, and serve as local probation officers.
