Defining Competency-based Education	Competency-based education focuses on students' ability to demonstrate mastery of specific skills & knowledge.
Student-centered Learning	Competency-based education shifts the focus from seat time to student mastery; fostering personalized learning experiences.
Flexible Pacing Options	Competency-based education allows students to progress at their own pace, ensuring a deeper understanding and retention, and respecting prior knowledge and experience.
Authentic Assessment	Competency-based education utilizes authentic assessments to measure the real-world application of skills and knowledge.
Standard Alignment	Students acquire and demonstrate their knowledge and skills by engaging in learning activities and experiences that are aligned with clearly defined programmatic outcomes and driven by the NAEYC Standards and Competencies for Early Childhood Professionals.
Video-based Observations	Video-based Skills & Competency Checks are used in field courses to assess competencies in the classroom. Students are granted several opportunities to achieve mastery over the course of the program.
Self-Assessment + Specific Feedback	Students self-assess; scoring their own efforts toward high-quality expectations prior to faculty review and verification. Faculty provide specific feedback and suggestions for goal setting.
