The Associate in Arts in Art and Design is primarily designed for students who wish to transfer to a four-year college or university. Students should work closely with an academic advisor to select courses needed for their intended major at the four-year institution they plan to attend. In addition to preparation for transfer, this program is designed to provide students with a strong general education background as well as a concentration in Painting/Drawing; Photography; Digital Cinema; Graphic Design or Ceramics/Sculpture.
